DAVID LUCK (Southern/Eastern Africa)

David was born in South Africa and grew up in Zambia spending much of his youth in the bush where he quickly developed a passion for the wilderness. Dave has travelled extensively in south and central Africa. He accompanied anti-poaching patrols to combat elephant and rhino poaching.

Since 1998 Dave has been leading privately guided trips in Botswana, Tanzania, Madagascar, Namibia, Zimbabwe, Zambia, South Africa, the Republic of Congo, Uganda and Rwanda. A passionate advocate of wild places and wildlife conservation for over 30 years, Dave is a master of creating an epic experience, teaching, engaging and inspiring travellers from novice to seasoned and especially younger adventurers.

Ethan is a 3rd generation Tanzanian, born and raised in a small village close to Arusha. Their enthusiasm rubbed off on him, and his favourite part of school was the outdoor pursuit's program that allowed him onto Mt. Meru and Mt. He came home to Tanzania at the beginning of 2004, having also completed a guiding course in South Africa. Ethan began work in Ruaha National Park and after two and a half years he moved back to Northern Serengeti.

SQUACK EVANS (Southern/Eastern Africa)

Early days of Squack's life were spent barefoot and carefree on a large cattle ranch in the south east of Zimbabwe.
